SECTION I

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND OF LUMBINI BUDDHIST UNIVERSITY

LUMBINI BUDDHIST UNIVERSITY (LBU)

Lumbini Buddhist University (LBU), from the birthplace of Gautam Buddha, Lumbini, is an autonomous and public institution of higher learning committed with the mission to educate the people of Nepal and enrich the global learning community through the application of core Buddhist values and to promote the World Peace.

Established by the Government of Nepal with a Parliament Act on June 17, 2004 under the concept presented by the First World Buddhist Summit held in Lumbini. The constituent campuses of the University and the Central Administration Offices are in Rupandehi, Nepal.

INCEPTION OF THE LUMBINI BUDDHIST UNIVERSITY

The first World Buddhist Summit held in Lumbini from 30th November to 2nd December, 1998 organized by Lumbini Development Trust, proposed to establish an International Buddhist University in Lumbini, the birthplace of Gautam Buddha, to impart standard education on Buddhist Philosophy, Literature and Culture, etc. Subsequently the Lumbini Declaration, issued on the concluding day of the Summit, requested the Nepal Government to take immediate action in this direction. Accordingly, Lumbini Development Trust constituted a seven-member Preparatory Committee with Prof. Dr. Tulasi Ram Vaidya as convener and Ven. Sudarshan Mahasthvir, Ven. Ngawang Hoser Lama, Rev. Badri Ratna Bajracharya, Prof. Mohan Prasad Lohani, Prof. Tri Ratna Manandhar and Mr. Min Bahadur Shakya as members.

Finally, on 14th Marga 2061 B.S. Lumbini Buddhist University was formally established with the promulgation of an Ordinance which was declared on 16th Marga 2061 B.S. at the 2nd World Buddhist Summit held in Lumbini. Subsequently, the Main Preparatory Committee meeting held on 23rd Marga 2061 B.S. took six important decisions including the renaming of the committee as “Lumbini Buddhist University Main Preparatory Committee 2061” Later in 2062 B.S., the Parliament approved the Ordinance with modifications as Lumbini Bauddha Vishwavidyalaya Ain 2063 (Lumbini Buddhist University Act).

LBU MISSION

Lumbini Buddhist University (LBU) is an autonomous institution whose mission is to expand the advantages of higher education to the people of Nepal and the overall learning community, in its role as a Centre for the advancement, dissemination and use of knowledge.

The Mission of Lumbini Buddhist University can be articulated into four dimensions which define the University as a Centre of Academic Excellence that promotes quality education with the highest academic standards; a source for the advancement, dissemination, and use of knowledge; a powerful engine for collective transformation, economic growth and sustainable development of the nation and the global learning community; a resource for community service and outreach, international initiative and cooperation .

In line with these principles, the University aims to become a Centre of Academic Excellence that promotes the production and dissemination of knowledge and the implementation of research

findings for the benefit of the overall community. Recognizing the international character of modern higher education, the University aims in fact at maintaining programs and standards which are fully comparable with any similar system of higher learning, thereby making it possible for promising Nepali students to obtain quality higher education without going abroad.

The highest aspiration of the University is to provide quality education in a way that promotes the holistic development of the students' abilities and personalities, enhances the knowledge of the youth in a spirit of understanding, universally shared principles, and dedication for best serving the common good. The University strives in fact to educate students to become committed citizens. As education shapes human life and the type of society we live in, improving the quality of life for everyone in the nation represents an essential commitment for Lumbini Buddhist University.

Conscious that a major motivation for students to attend a university is the preparation for a future profession and career, the University aims at bridging the world of thoughts and ideas with the world of practice and action, by preparing skilled and qualified students who are prepared to assume responsible positions in our society and actively contribute to the national development.

To enhance the educational standards, LBU aims at establishing fruitful partnerships and collaboration with universities and higher education institutions of international reputation, for the overall welfare of both the academic faculty members and students and by encouraging their participation in exchange programs, setting up credit transfer schemes and submitting joint research projects.

While Lumbini Buddhist University is a non-political institution in practice and intent, it recognizes and promotes the right of individuals to freedom of thoughts and self-expression. Consistent with this right, the University respects and holds shared responsibility towards all the diverse members of the University community and the learning community at large.

The University strives to achieve these ends by pursuing the advantages of a culturally diverse and newly emerging University Community, open to the exchange of ideas and where discovery, creativity, and personal and professional development can flourish.

These dimensions of the Mission (Centre of Academic Excellence, source of knowledge production, engine of societal transformation, and resource for community service and international initiative) identify and define the Umbrella Goal Areas described later in this section and within which this Strategic Plan develops more specific objectives and strategic actions.

LBU VISION

The mission of Lumbini Buddhist University is to create a community of individuals who will work towards world peace, harmony, and prosperity by integrating Buddhist principles into their daily lives and activities. Through its teachings, the university aims to produce graduates who are not only intellectually competent but also morally sound, wise, talented, non-violent, and secular individuals who think and work not only for their own but for the betterment of society.

Lumbini Buddhist University has a noble vision of promoting world peace, harmony, and prosperity through its teachings and research. It strives to achieve this by offering comprehensive education in various fields of Buddhist philosophy, literature, education, culture, and other subjects that facilitate the cultivation of precepts and human virtues such as peace, empathy, Maitri, and compassion.

Lumbini Buddhist University strives to be a **Centre of Academic Excellence in teaching and scholarship, at the service of the People of Nepal and the global learning community, by promoting a culture based on dedicated teaching, continuous learning, creativity, and cutting-edge research, with the highest academic standards.**

This Vision reflects the Mission of the University to expand the advantages of quality higher education to the people of Lumbini Province, the nation, and the broader global learning community, in its role as a Centre for the advancement, dissemination, and use of knowledge.

Lumbini Buddhist University holds in fact the ambitious vision to **shape the Academic Identity of the whole Lumbini Province and the country in general.** The Institution considers itself as an agent of socio-cultural transformation and a powerful engine for economic growth, innovation, and sustainable development of the Lumbini Province, other provinces of the country, the nation, and the world that the University serves.

GUIDING VALUES

Triratna (Triple-Gem) and Lumbini Buddhist University

Lumbini Buddhist University (LBU) is envisioned to follow the principles of the Triratna in Buddhism as it develops in Lumbini, Butwal, and Devdaha. Triratna, or the Triple Gem, is a fundamental concept in Buddhism representing the Buddha, the Dharma (teachings of the Buddha), and the Sangha (the community of Buddhist practitioners).

Incorporating the Triratna concept into the development of LBU means that the university should aim to embody the values and teachings of Buddhism in its educational framework, administration, and community engagement.

- I. **Buddha:** LBU aims to honor the teachings and philosophy of Gautama Buddha. This includes promoting mindfulness, compassion, and wisdom in all aspects of academic and personal development.

Courses and programs offered by LBU must emphasize the study of Buddhist scriptures, teachings, and the life of the Buddha.

- II. **Dharma:** LBU curriculum will focus on disseminating the core teachings of Buddhism, including ethics, meditation, philosophy, and psychology.

Research conducted within LBU will contribute to the advancement and understanding of Buddhist philosophy and its application in contemporary society.

- III. **Sangha:** LBU will foster a supportive and inclusive community of students, faculty, and staff who are dedicated to Buddhist principles.

The university will serve as a place for spiritual practice, dialogue, and collaboration among members of the Buddhist community.

Engaging with local communities in Lumbini, Butwal, and Devdaha to promote social welfare, environmental sustainability, and peace-building initiatives in line with Buddhist values.

In developing LBU in these regions, it's essential to integrate the Triratna concept not only into academic programs but also into the ethos of the university as a whole. By doing so, LBU can become a center for Buddhist learning, practice, and community engagement, contributing to the preservation and propagation of Buddhist ideals in Nepal and beyond.

Academic Excellence

Lumbini Buddhist University strives to create and sustain a culture that supports scholarship and teaching excellence in all academic units. It tries to link academic excellence to cutting-edge research through scholarly exploration, the foundation of critical and analytic thinking, and promoting a ‘can-do’ attitude and culture. The University aspires to an academic excellence which is comprehensive of both individual and collective diligent efforts and is committed to pursue excellence by meeting national, regional, and global standards of ethics, as well as personal expectations.

Inclusiveness and Respect

Lumbini Buddhist University welcomes ‘difference’, thus it regards the diversity of its faculty, staff, and students as a great asset. The University firmly believes that respect for one-self and for others is essential for nurturing free and open discourse, creative exploration and inventive expression that characterize a university. The Institution thus promotes the value of academic freedom, acting ethically, critical independence, creativity, innovation, equity, justice, loyalty, and respect.

Environmental Responsibility

Lumbini Buddhist University holds environmental responsibility and is committed to preserve the rights of future generations to a healthy environment. The University recognizes the importance of environmental education for all members of the academic community and the meaning of environmentally responsible practices in developing the physical characteristics of its community and efficient use of resources.

Global Citizenship

Lumbini Buddhist University embraces its role to prepare engaged and responsible citizenship at regional, national, and global levels. Thus, it strives to inspire through education the ability to build connection and partnership with others, work in a collegial way towards a common goal, stimulates the power of discovery and the foundation of critical and analytic thinking.

Leadership

Lumbini Buddhist University strives to instil in every student the spirit of leadership and to infuse the value, the confidence, and the experience to lead change in their world. Through academic education, it encourages in its faculty, staff, and students the readiness to take responsibility for one’s own academic and professional development and learning, open mindedness when dealing with change.

Discovery and Creativity

Lumbini Buddhist University supports all its members in this life-long process that is both challenging and rewarding. The University promotes scholarship and its dissemination through teaching and outreach, creative experimentation of ideas and concepts, and intellectual freedom that supports open inquiry.

LBU OVERARCHING GOALS

To achieve its mission of pursuing Academic Excellence in teaching, scholarship, and research,

Lumbini Buddhist University has identified overarching goals that are timeless and enduring. The goals outlined below express the University's long-term commitment to the people of Nepal and the global learning community.

A. Teaching and Scholarship

- I. Promote a culture of teaching, scholarship, and research among the local and international community by offering programs with the highest academic standards.
- II. Support higher education with a special focus on technical and applied sciences and foster extensive use of information technology.
- III. Attract and retain a diverse faculty who are outstanding scholars and teachers, as well as an excellent and diverse staff who will provide owing support to faculty and students. Promote multi-disciplinary programs and encourage the faculties to work together to run cross-faculty and multi-disciplinary programs.

B. World-Class Education

- I. Expand the opportunity of higher education in the country by promoting programs that are designed to meet the needs of the students, the challenges of the new professions and the requirements of potential employers.
- II. Form skilled and qualified students that are prepared to assume responsible positions in our society and actively contribute to national development.

C. Holistic Development

- I. Offer liberal education by enhancing flexibility and freedom in academic programs, foster learning experiences in an environment supportive of the holistic development of student's personality, and nurture intellectual growth and commitment to responsibility and service.
- II. Enroll, educate, and graduate the most deserving student body possible and make it possible for promising Nepali students to pursue quality higher studies in the country without going overseas.

D. Job Oriented Programs

- I. Understanding that a major motivation for students to attend a university is the preparation for a future profession and progressive career, the University aims at preparing skilled and qualified students that are prepared to assume responsible positions in our society and actively contribute to the national development.
- II. Create and promote philosophical programs under the university to the job oriented dimensions.

E. Research and Community Service

- I. Grounded on the University's recognition of the importance of research and dissemination of its findings, the University strongly supports the expansion of knowledge through research and creative activities in both fundamental and applied fields.
- II. Foster the application of such knowledge and promotes the access of the results of the

applied research by the overall community.

- III. Strengthen the public engagement of the University in scholarship and research with local, national, and international communities.

F. Internationalization

- I. Provide a pluralistic setting in which Nepalese of diverse backgrounds as well as individuals of other nationalities meet, study and work together, learning to value cooperation, tolerance, and mutual support.
- II. Develop the detailed conceptual framework for “ The Board of Trustee”, implement it through international community and explore Lumbini Buddhist University as an international educational hub for Buddhist studies and research.
- III. Sustain an intellectual atmosphere, where the diversity of faculty, staff, and students represents the greatest asset of the University;
- IV. Establishing a community of scholars and students where mutual understanding and wisdom can rise and flourish in the spirit of universally shared principles and dedication for best serving the common good.

UNIVERSITY’S PRIMARY STRATEGY

Lumbini Buddhist University has identified major directions for guiding its growth and further expansion in the coming years. Based on a need assessment of the University’s major internal and external stakeholders, Lumbini Buddhist University has prepared a way out for being a Multi-faculty University. The Plan points out overarching goals, specific objectives, and strategic actions, to be implemented and achieved based on medium and long-term priorities. The major directions that will guide the development of the University over the next years can be summarized into the following eight Goals:

Academic Excellence

- I. LBU strives to enhance Academic Excellence across the University by sustaining teaching excellence and scholarship in all academic units;
- II. Promoting and strengthening learning and research activities in the field of Science and Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences, Management Studies and Educational Sciences, and in all relevant aspects of the contemporary society;
- III. Enhancing the educational standards of the University by implementing academic programs based on credit-semester system and strict quality control, providing the most suitable teacher-student ratio, introducing and applying the latest technological advancement in all academic activities;
- IV. Expanding the academic offer in terms of graduate and undergraduate programs.
- V. Fostering holistic development of students as conditions for academic and life success; nurturing intellectual growth and commitment to responsibility and service.

Faculty Excellence

Faculty Excellence refers to the pursue of excellence in teaching and scholarship, as both aspects are critical components of faculty excellence. Effective teaching is a central responsibility of faculty, schools, departments, as well as a key component of each faculty member's professional activity. Fostering faculty diversity and supporting the recruitment and retention of outstanding teaching faculty are the highest priorities for LBU.

Excellence in Research, Scholarship, and Creativity

This Goal emphasizes the importance of raising the quality and stature of faculties, campuses and department to a position of academic leadership and providing support for research, scholarship, and creativity in a careful, strategic, and cost-effective way. Meeting cost-effectiveness needs is a highly important aspect because of the high costs of research, the competitive environment for external support to research, and the financial pressures on areas with less potential for external funding.

Award And Recognition Policy

LBU's Degree Awarding Policy is designed to enhance student engagement and reduce dropout rates by implementing a progressive award system. Upon the successful completion of the first year of LBU's bachelor-level academic program, students will be awarded a Certificate of Completion, instilling a sense of accomplishment and motivation to continue their studies. The second year achievement merits a Diploma of Achievement, recognizing advancing academic progress, while the third year completion leads to an Advanced Diploma, acknowledging advanced accomplishments and sustained commitment. Those who successfully complete all four years are awarded a Bachelor's Degree, marking comprehensive academic success. This policy not only aims to celebrate students at various milestones but also strives to attract and retain a higher number of students by offering tangible achievements right from the first year, thereby fostering a positive and supportive academic environment. Regular reviews and adjustments ensure the policy's relevance and effectiveness in achieving its goals.

Certificate Level

- Eligibility: Successful completion of the first year of LBU's bachelor-level academic program,
- Objective: Encourage students to complete the first year, providing a sense of accomplishment

Diploma Level

- Eligibility: Successful completion of the second year of LBU's bachelor-level academic program
- Award: Diploma of Achievement
- Objective: Motivate students to continue to the second year, recognizing their academic progress

Advanced Diploma Level

- Eligibility: Successful completion of the third year of LBU's bachelor-level academic program
- Award: Advanced Diploma
- Objective: Acknowledge students' advanced academic achievements and commitment to the program

Bachelor's Degree

- Eligibility: Successful completion of all four years of LBU's bachelor-level academic program
- Award: Bachelor's Degree

Awarding and Certification

Lumbini Buddhist University (LBU) aims to facilitate the academic journey of students from various universities in Nepal and abroad by offering a credit transfer process. Recognizing the efforts and accomplishments of students studying elsewhere, LBU provides a platform for them to continue their education and earn a degree, adhering to defined criteria and requirements set forth by LBU.

1. Eligibility Criteria:

- Students from any university in Nepal or abroad are eligible to apply for credit transfer to LBU.
- Applicants must provide transcripts and course outlines from their current or previous institution(s).
- The courses taken by the students must align with the curriculum offered by LBU, ensuring compatibility and relevance.

2. Credit Evaluation Process:

- Upon receiving applications, LBU's academic committee will conduct a thorough evaluation of the credits earned by the students.
- Evaluation will be based on the comparability of courses, learning outcomes, and academic standards.
- Credits will be transferred if they meet the equivalency requirements established by LBU.

3. Defined Criteria and Requirements:

- LBU has defined criteria and requirements for each program offered, which students must fulfill to be eligible for degree completion.
- These criteria encompass a certain number of credits to be earned from LBU itself, specific courses to be completed, and any additional academic or practical requirements.

4. Counseling and Guidance:

- LBU provides counseling and guidance to prospective students regarding the credit transfer process.
- Trained advisors assist students in understanding the requirements, selecting appropriate courses, and planning their academic journey at LBU.

5. Degree Awarding Process:

- Upon successful completion of the required credits and fulfillment of all criteria, LBU will award a degree to the transferred students.
- The degree awarded will be equivalent to the program pursued at LBU, ensuring parity and recognition in the academic and professional realms.

6. Transparency and Accountability:

- LBU maintains transparency throughout the credit transfer process, providing clear guidelines and communication to students.
- The academic committee ensures accountability in evaluating credits and enforcing the defined criteria, maintaining the integrity of LBU's academic standards.

Academic Credit Bank

The concept of an Academic Credit Bank typically involves a system where students can accumulate academic credits over time, which can be transferred or applied towards different academic programs or qualifications within the university or even across different institutions. Here's how such a system will function at Lumbini Buddhist University:

Accumulation of Credits: Students earn credits by successfully completing courses or academic activities. These credits could be based on factors such as the number of hours spent on coursework, the complexity of the material, or the level of mastery demonstrated.

Credit Transferability: Credits earned by students are stored in their academic credit bank account. These credits can then be transferred between different programs or departments within the university, allowing students flexibility in designing their academic paths.

Recognition of Prior Learning: The system may also recognize prior learning experiences, such as work experience, military service, or self-directed study, by granting academic credits for relevant knowledge and skills acquired outside the traditional classroom setting.

Credit Conversion: There might be a mechanism for converting credits earned from one academic program or institution to another. This could involve assessing the equivalency of courses or modules and determining the appropriate credit transfer.

Flexible Degree Pathways: An Academic Credit Bank promotes flexibility in degree pathways, allowing students to customize their educational journey according to their interests, career goals, and prior learning experiences.

Quality Assurance: There would likely be quality assurance mechanisms in place to ensure that transferred credits meet the academic standards of the receiving program or institution. This could

involve assessment of learning outcomes, alignment with curriculum standards, and verification of credentials.

Transparent Documentation: The system should maintain transparent documentation of students' credit records, detailing the courses completed, the credits earned, and any transfer or conversion processes undertaken. This documentation facilitates academic advising and ensures transparency and accountability in credit management.

Continuous Monitoring and Evaluation: Regular monitoring and evaluation of the Academic Credit Bank system would be necessary to identify areas for improvement, address challenges, and ensure that the system remains responsive to the evolving needs of students and the academic community.

Implementing an Academic Credit Bank at Lumbini Buddhist University could potentially enhance the educational experience for students, promote lifelong learning, and facilitate greater mobility and flexibility within the university's academic programs. However, specific details and policies would need to be developed in consultation with relevant stakeholders to ensure the successful implementation and operation of such a system.

Documents Archive/Gallery

The Documents Archive at Lumbini Buddhist University will serve as a centralized repository for storing academic documents and other pertinent records of students, faculty, staff, and the university itself. It aims to preserve and provide access to valuable documents related to academic achievements, research outputs, administrative records, and historical artifacts.

The archive will collect a diverse range of documents, including:

- Academic transcripts, diplomas, and certificates
- Research papers, theses, and dissertations
- Administrative records such as meeting minutes, policies, and reports
- Personal documents of historical or cultural significance
- Artifacts related to the university's history and heritage.

Showcasing, Digitalization and Preservation: Lumbini Buddhist University will develop the documents showcasing centre at Central Library of Lumbini Buddhist University. This centre will develop a detailed functional guideline for its operation. Furthermore, documents will be digitized to ensure long-term preservation and accessibility. High-quality scanning equipment and archival-grade storage systems will be employed to digitize and store physical documents securely.

Access and Permissions: The archive will provide controlled access to authorized users, including students, faculty, researchers, and external stakeholders. Access permissions will be determined based on the sensitivity and confidentiality of the documents. Online portals and search functionalities will facilitate easy retrieval of documents while maintaining data security and privacy.

Showcasing and Exhibition: The Documents Archive will feature a dedicated exhibition space within Lumbini Buddhist University to showcase selected documents, artifacts, and historical materials of significance. Rotating exhibits and thematic displays will highlight the university's academic achievements, cultural heritage, and contributions to scholarship and community development.

Educational and Research Opportunities: The archive will serve as a resource for academic research, teaching, and learning. Students and scholars will have access to primary source materials for conducting research projects, exploring historical trends, and deepening their understanding of Buddhist philosophy, culture, and education.

Tripitak Park in Kapilbastu

- VI. Established its campuses in Butwal and Devdaha.
- VII. Established a modern Central office in Lumbini (Premises of Lumbini Development Trust)

Achievements mentioned above are highly significant, Lumbini Buddhist University remains committed to continue enhancing and further developing the campus at all levels and expanding its academic offer of undergraduate and graduate programs.

ACADEMIC LEADERSHIP AND MILESTONES

20 SHRAWAN 2062 TO 19 SHRAWAN 2066

During this period, Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Tulsiram Baidhha and Registrar Kedar Shakya and Khadgaman Shrestha were the leading officials in the university.

Academic Concept

In the first phase of this period, the university aimed to create five departments: Theravada Buddhism Department, Mahayana Buddhism Department, Vajrayana Buddhism Department, History Department, Sanskrit Archaeology Department, Scripts Department, Language and Literature Department, and Department of Buddhism. Tulsiram Baidhy's Concept Paper was presented in the Debadah Rupandehi on 11th of Shrawan 2064.

Similarly, in the second phase, University aimed to conduct activities through the Faculty of Philosophy and Humanities and Social Sciences. The aim was to have a Theravada Buddhism Department, Mahayana Buddhism Department, and Vajrayana Buddhism Department under the Faculty of Religious Philosophy. Similarly, within the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences, the Department of History, Culture, Department of Archaeology, Department of Politics, Department of Economics, Department of Sociology and Anthropology, Department of Buddhism, Department of Language and Literature, Department of Buddhism, Department of Language and Literature were aimed to establish.

In this period, the main aim was to develop the university as an international-level residential university.

The Major Achievement

At this time, apart from appointing limited staff to open the liaison office of the university and

appointing Mr. Indra Kafle as a teacher in Lumbini, it was supposed to conduct remarkable progress in implementing the programmatically mentioned subjects during this period. During this period, the university established a liaison office in Bhairahawa.

27TH FALGUN 2066 TO 26TH FALGUN 2070

During this period, Vice-Chancellor Prof. Dr. Triratna Manandhar and Registrar Khadgaman Shrestha for the first year and Registrar Pitambar Lal Yadav for the last three years were the prominent officials of the university.

During that period, the university conducted a degree-based educational program, focusing mainly on the undergraduate level. Consequently, the university's academic efforts were primarily geared toward undergraduates. In this timeframe, it was deemed appropriate to initiate the educational program at the undergraduate level and gradually extend it to post-graduate and other levels. The objective was the production of academic professionals through the initial educational program, commencing at the undergraduate tier and progressing to post-graduate and advanced levels.

In this period, alongside three significant fields of Buddhist studies at the postgraduate level, the university opted to introduce five additional degree-based subjects. These included Mahayana Buddhist studies, Theravada Buddhist studies, Himalayan Buddhist studies, and Peace and Buddhist studies. Private and public colleges expressed interest in adopting these programs offered by Lumbini Buddhist University. Religious organizations had to navigate the relationship between religion and language during this phase. While they did not explicitly mention religion, it was natural for religious adherents to hold such aspirations. Moreover, they sought to incorporate the traditional educational system into the university's framework and its mode of instruction. This posed a challenge during this period. Despite this, the university aimed to adhere to the historical standards of modern universities and even accommodate the traditional Buddhist education system, including establishing regulations tailored to it. The intention was to honor the long-standing presence of Buddhism in Nepal by designing separate curricula and examinations for traditional Buddhist education.

The Bhot language, frequently employed in the local educational system, seems eager to be incorporated into the mainstream of university education by the Mahayana sect, a long-standing and active tradition in Nepal's Himalayan region. The university prepared the syllabus following this. Although the course had several advantages, Tibetan was the language of instruction and exams. The requirement that teaching and examination languages in other disciplines must be either English or Nepali, while reasonable for language-related issues, could have hindered growth. The university built academic and administrative buildings on the Lumbini campus to deliver classes at various levels throughout this time.

Major Achievements

The first senate meeting during this tenure was completed in Shrawan 2067. In terms of policymaking, this meeting was fruitful. In the year 2067, Buddhist studies under Mahayana at Sugat Buddhist College in Lalitpur, Practical Buddhist studies at Lotus Academic College in Lalitpur, Theravada Buddhist studies at Theravada Buddhist Academy in Baneshwar, Himalayan Buddhist studies at Lumbini College of Buddhism and Himalayan Studies in Chawahil, Kathmandu and Buddhist-based studies were initiated. The teaching work of the master 's-level Buddhist studies program on peace and Buddhist studies was commenced at the Bauddha Multiple campus.

The first meeting of the University senate was completed on 14th Ashad 2067, after the rules were passed. In 2070, postgraduate-level classes were conducted at an engineering campus through affiliation.

During this tenure, only two scholars graduated. Undergraduate and postgraduate-level educational programs were conducted, and academic relations with foreign universities, including Japan and India, were established and expanded. Permanent appointments were made for six teachers and 11 employees who were members of the Theravada Buddhist Organization. Cooperation with Buddhist organizations such as *Dharmodaya Sabha* was achieved, and the construction of the academic building was completed. Additionally, the structure of the administrative building in Lumbini, which had two *bighas* of land at the Parsa intersection of Lumbini, was initiated. The achievements of this period were significant during the four years at Lumbini Buddhist University.

FROM 2071 KARTIK 15 TO 2074 KARTIK 16.

During that period, the focal authority at the university was Vice-Chancellor Prof. Dr. Nareshman Bajracharya, and Pitambar Lal Yadab served as the registrar for the first year, followed by Dr. Tilak Acharya for the last three years.

Academic Concept

During that time, the university established the Academic Master Plan Drafting Committee, known as the “ Master Plan Drafting Committee.” The proposals for establishing and revising degrees were approved during the sixth and seventh assemblies of the university, based on the bill formulated by the drafting committee. According to this master plan, 12 academic departments were scheduled to be established at Lumbini Buddhist University:

- I. Department of Theravada Buddhism
- II. Department of Mahayana Buddhism
- III. Department of Vajrayana Buddhism
- IV. Department of Buddhist History
- V. Department of Buddhism of Nepal Mandala

- VI. Department of Buddhist Art and Architecture
- VII. Department of Buddhism and Himalayan Studies
- VIII. Department of Buddhism and Tradition in East and West
- IX. Department of Traditional Buddhist and Other Health Care System
- X. Department of Archaeology and Museology
- XI. Department of Applied Buddhism
- XII. Department of General Subjects

These educational programs were initially conducted through affiliated campuses, with plans to establish separate campuses and continue teaching and learning activities.

Division of Educational Programs

During that period, the educational programs were categorized into three sections: Core Buddhist Subjects, New Buddhist Subjects, and General Subjects.

Core Buddhist Subjects

Within this framework, teachings encompassed Sanskrit, Pali, Chinese, and Tibetan languages and ancient Buddhist study methods. Instructions on Theravada, Mahayana, and Vajrayana Buddhism were provided to local and foreign Buddhist monks/nuns, followers, and other interested individuals within the community.

New Buddhist Subjects

Subjects related to Buddhist studies, such as history, philosophy, scriptures, literature, art, architecture, culture, and tradition, were taught. The aim was to broaden the influence of Buddhist philosophy in social, educational, and cultural contexts, including the establishment of the modern Buddhist campaign.

General Subjects

This category aimed to teach professional and technical subjects to complement fundamental Buddhist education. The goal was to organize general education programs by affiliating with various colleges and educational institutions and raising necessary financial resources for Lumbini Buddhist University.

Initiative to Amend the Law

During that time, an initiative was undertaken to amend the university's law. The goal was to eliminate the term "community level" from the law. This term had been included and excluded at different points in the law's history. The amendment aimed to promote peace, brotherhood, friendship, and harmony by embracing and following the teachings of Lord Gautama Buddha by incorporating government to the University. It also involved updating the wording to include cultural activities and subjects while removing the reference to the "community-level" act.

Major Achievements

- I. The university had successfully integrated technical, vocational, and general education through engineering and professional management education under Applied Buddhism.
- II. Noteworthy educational achievements during this tenure included master's level archaeology and museology programs in Kathmandu, a bachelor's level program in travel and tourism management in Butwal, and the establishment of other regular program offerings.

Physical Infrastructure Accomplishments

- I. One of the significant physical achievements was the acquisition of four *Bighas* of land in Khadaiya from the Lumbini Development Trust, facilitated by the Government of Nepal.
- II. Key infrastructure achievements included commencing the construction of dormitories, teachers' residences, and authorities' residences, as well as progress on the establishment of the office.

Human Resources

From a human resources perspective, this tenure saw little progress. Limited advancements were made, primarily promoting a few contract teachers and administrative staffs.

Economic Perspective

The financial situation during this period took some work as the university grew and faced limited resources depending on the government.

Administrative Developments

During this period, the focus was on approving and implementing regulations related to educational administration rather than those concerning financial administration.

The First Convocation Ceremony and Office Transfer

The first convocation ceremony had taken place. Office transfer occurred, with the Liaison Office in Kathmandu relocated and regular operations commencing from the Central Office in Lumbini.

FROM 28TH, BAISAKH 2075, TO 27TH, BAISAKH 2079

During this later period, Prof. Dr. Hridaya Ratna Bajracharya and Dr. Tilak Ram Acharya served as the central authorities in the university.

Educational Concept

The educational programs were categorized into Core Buddhism, Social Obligation, and International Cooperation.

Major Achievements

- I. The School of Development Studies and Applied Science was successfully established.
- II. Operations of the BA LLB program was initiated.

Infrastructure Developments

Lumbini Buddhist University (LBU) made remarkable strides in enhancing its academic infrastructure and reach. Establishing a Central Library Building and Research Centre is an achievement to LBU's commitment to fostering a learning and research excellence culture.

Furthermore, LBU's visionary expansion led to establishment of a new college named "City Campus" in Nayagaun, Butwal. This strategic move increased the university's geographic footprint and extended its academic offerings and accessibility to a broader student base. Lumbini Buddhist University demonstrated its dedication to providing a holistic and enriching educational experience by consistently innovating and investing in its physical and educational infrastructure.

Human Resources

During this tenure, Lumbini Buddhist University's Human Resource Management played a pivotal role in the efficient functioning of the institution by overseeing various essential tasks. The department successfully executed the recruitment and promotion processes for permanent and contracted human resources, teaching, and administrative officials. Through meticulous planning and rigorous evaluation, the Human Resource team identified and brought in skilled individuals who possessed the necessary qualifications and aligned with the university's values and vision.

Economic Aspect

Lumbini Buddhist University (LBU) demonstrated strategic foresight by forging valuable collaborations with stakeholders such as the Grants Commission, Central and Provincial Governments, and international organizations. These partnerships were instrumental in addressing and enhancing the university's financial landscape. By working closely with the Grants Commission, LBU secured vital funding that empowered the institution to expand its academic programs, infrastructure, and research initiatives. Third cohort of permanent administrative and academic human resources are hired recently by Falgun 2080.

6. **Cybersecurity Enhancements:** Strengthening cybersecurity measures to protect digital assets, sensitive data, and user privacy. Implementing firewalls, intrusion detection systems, regular security audits, user awareness training, and incident response plans are key actions.
7. **Virtual Labs and Simulations:** Developing virtual lab environments and simulations to facilitate practical learning in various disciplines. Collaboration with faculty to design virtual labs, develop interactive simulations, and integrate them into the curriculum is a crucial action.

Learning Management System (LMS)

1. **LMS Implementation:** Choosing a suitable Learning Management System aligned with the university's goals and requirements. Actions include evaluating LMS options, considering features, scalability, and user-friendliness, and initiating the implementation process.

2. **Course Content Migration:** Transferring existing course contents, materials, and resources onto the LMS platform. Collaborating with faculty to upload materials, videos, assignments, and assessments onto the LMS is a key action.
3. **Faculty Training and Onboarding:** Training faculty members on effectively using the LMS for course delivery, interaction, and assessment. Organizing training workshops, webinars, and tutorials on LMS usage and pedagogical best practices is a crucial action.
4. **Student Onboarding and Support:** Familiarizing students with the LMS interface and functionalities to ensure smooth adoption. Developing user guides, conducting orientation sessions, and offering ongoing technical support are key actions.
5. **Assessment and Feedback Integration:** Enabling digital assessment tools and mechanisms, along with timely feedback provision. Training faculty on creating online quizzes and assignments, implementing auto-grading features, and ensuring prompt feedback are key actions.
6. **Collaborative Learning Spaces:** Establishing virtual spaces within the LMS for group projects, discussions, and collaborative learning. Configuring discussion forums, group chat features, and collaborative document editing tools are key actions.
7. **Multimedia Repository:** Developing a repository within the LMS for storing and sharing multimedia resources. Designing the repository interface, categorizing resources, and ensuring easy accessibility are key actions.

Strengthening Web-Based Education Management Information System (EMIS)

1. **Comprehensive System Assessment:** Evaluating the existing EMIS to identify strengths, weaknesses, and areas for improvement.
2. **Technology Upgrade and Integration:** Upgrading the EMIS system to integrate with ERP systems. Identifying necessary technology updates, ensuring compatibility with other systems, and performing seamless integration are key actions.
3. **User-Centric Interface Design:** Redesigning the user interface of the EMIS to be intuitive, user-friendly, and responsive. Focusing on UI/UX to design a visually appealing and easy-to-navigate interface and upgrading report systems in graphical presentation are key actions.
4. **Data Accuracy and Integrity Enhancement:** Implementing data validation mechanisms and workflows to ensure accuracy and integrity. Developing automated validation checks, user-friendly error notifications, and data correction procedures are key actions.
5. **Real-Time Data Reporting:** Enabling real-time generation of reports and analytics for informed decision-making. Developing reporting templates, integrating data visualization tools, and providing training on report generation are key actions.
6. **Student Management:** Streamlining enrollment and student records management. Developing automated online enrollment and improving student record management are key actions.
7. **Continuous Training and Support:** Providing ongoing training and support for faculty and administrators to use the EMIS effectively. Offering regular training sessions, developing training materials, conducting workshops, and providing a dedicated support channel are key actions.

Digital Resource Development and Dissemination

1. **Content Digitization:** Converting physical resources into digital formats, including textbooks, lecture notes, and research materials. Scanning or digitizing print materials, ensuring text recognition accuracy, and storing resources in digital repositories are key actions.
2. **Multimedia Creation:** Developing multimedia resources such as videos, animations, and interactive simulations to enhance learning. Collaborating with faculty and multimedia experts to design engaging learning materials is a key action.
3. **Open Educational Resources (OER):** Exploring and curating online educational resources to supplement existing materials. Identifying relevant OER platforms, selecting resources aligned with courses, and ensuring proper attribution are key actions.
4. **Digital Libraries and Repositories:** Establishing digital libraries and repositories to organize and store educational resources. Developing user-friendly interfaces, categorizing resources, and ensuring accessibility for faculty and students are key actions.
5. **Digital Studio:** Producing high-quality educational content, including audio/video lectures, online courses, simulations, and other interactive learning materials. Ensuring a high-quality studio with well-equipped materials and technology is a key action.
6. **Online Resource Sharing Platforms:** Creating online platforms for sharing and accessing digital resources within and beyond the university. Developing user-friendly platforms, enabling resource uploads, and encouraging user contributions are key actions.
7. **Feedback and Improvement Loop:** Gathering feedback from faculty and students to continuously improve and update digital resources. Conducting regular feedback cycles every semester, collecting user feedback, analyzing resource usage data, and making necessary updates are key actions.

Human Resource Development

1. **Training Needs Assessment:** Identifying the IT skills and knowledge gaps among faculty and staff for effective digitization. Conducting surveys, interviews, and assessments to understand skill levels and training requirements are key actions.
2. **Customized Training Programs:** Developing tailored training programs to address specific IT skill gaps and enhance digital literacy. Designing training materials, workshops, and online courses aligned with identified needs are key actions.
3. **Staff IT Empowerment Workshops:** Conducting workshops for non-academic staff to enhance their IT proficiency for administrative tasks. Focusing on software usage, data management, and office automation tools is a key action.
4. **Reward:** Promoting and rewarding teaching and non-teaching staff for the best performance in the usage of skills. Developing a learning attitude through rewards and recognition is a key action.
5. **Professional Development Tracks:** Establishing IT-focused tracks within the university's professional development framework.

ACTION PLAN

GOAL AREAS

This section clearly describes the Goal Areas and identifies action plan towards which LBU will be focusing and directing efforts in the coming years.

The specific action plans detailed below suggest that the LBU should move on a significant number of fronts to keep abreast of competition, respond to a rapidly changing environment, and enhance academic strengths. Whereas all the objectives are important as such, a shortage of financial resources and human constraints will make this difficult in some cases and will require setting priorities among the objectives for the next years.

The present section tries to phase the specific objectives and set- out priorities over the near future. These priorities suggest which objectives should be addressed first and thus have implications for the phasing in of efforts directed at each objective.

The highest priority of this plan is Academic and Faculty excellence, which implies special attention and focus on critical components, such as teaching and scholarship, research and creativity, and undergraduate and graduate education over the next years. These components are interrelated and crosscutting to the various activities of the University and have important ties to each of the LBU vision and mission aspects.

Moreover, these components also represent the principal foundations for LBU's stature and reputation, thus, are contingent on the quality of the education and faculty. Scholarship and teaching, for example, are inextricably bound together in an University, and for LBU constitute the principal pathway for sustaining and building the pre-eminences of the University and achieving the longer-term aspiration of this academic roadmap.

Even though ranked at the end of the Goal Areas, the Goal dealing with financial management and resource rationalization represents an essential part of the Academic Plan and a crucial area of concern for the University. Limited funding and budgetary allocations represent indeed a potential threat to delivering quality education and constitute an essential precondition for the University's further growth and expansion.

For each of these goal areas and specific objectives, Strategic Actions are also proposed, which are University-wide initiatives directed at tackling the main priorities of the Vision.
